CRIMINAL:

• Trials

- The court will hold in-custody jury trials and bench trials (including trials on contempt charges) as scheduled unless the Presiding Judge determines there is good cause to postpone a particular trial. All in-custody trials will occur inperson in the Courthouse with the assigned judge.
- All out-of-custody jury trials:
 - Currently scheduled November 1, 2020 March 31, 2021, will be canceled and the case will be scheduled for a mandatory settlement conference to be held the week of January 11, 2021 at The Grand Theatre Ballroom. Following the settlement conference, out-of-custody jury trials may be scheduled at The Grand Theatre Ballroom between February 16 and March 19, 2021.
 - New jury trials may be scheduled on or after April 1, 2021.
 - A party must file a Motion for In-Person Hearing with the Presiding Judge if they wish to proceed <u>in-person</u> in the Courthouse prior to April 1, 2021.
- o All **out-of-custody bench trials** (including trials on contempt charges):
 - Currently scheduled November 1, 2020 March 31, 2021, will be canceled and scheduled for a status conference at any time or rescheduled for a bench trial on or after April 1, 2021, <u>UNLESS</u> the parties agree to proceed as scheduled by <u>remote means</u>.
 - ➤ If the parties agree to proceed as scheduled by <u>remote means</u>, the bench trial will proceed unless the Presiding Judge determines there is good cause to postpone a particular bench trial.
 - ➤ All bench trials will occur by <u>remote means</u> with the assigned judge.
 - New bench trials may be scheduled with the assigned judge in the normal course prior to April 1, 2021, only if the parties agree to proceed by remote means, if not, the case will be scheduled for a status conference at any time or scheduled for a bench trial to be held on or after April 1, 2021.
 - A party must file a Motion for In-Person Hearing with the Presiding Judge if they wish to proceed <u>in-person</u> in the Courthouse prior to April 1, 2021.
- If the Marion County Circuit Court is subject to Level 3 restrictions under CJO 20-016, all out-of-custody jury and bench trials will be postponed to a date on or after April 1, 2021.

• Status Conferences and Pretrial Hearings

O The court will continue to conduct status conferences and pretrial hearings as scheduled on all criminal cases. Such proceedings shall be conducted by <u>remote means</u>. Defense attorneys shall ensure that defendants sign a written acknowledgement of the next court date and return the acknowledgement to the court within 14 days.

Hearings

o In-custody

- Including arraignments, probation violation hearings, pleas/sentencings, probable cause hearings, release hearings, substitution hearings, and motions will proceed as scheduled <u>in-person</u> or by <u>remote means</u>.
- In-custody hearings may be heard at the annex or in the Courthouse with the assigned judge.

Out-of-custody

- Arraignments for defendants *cited to appear* at the Criminal Court Annex will occur <u>in-person</u> at the Criminal Court Annex as directed by the citation. Out-of-custody arraignments for defendants *with a release agreement to appear* at the Criminal Court Annex will occur by <u>remote means or in-person</u> as directed by the release agreement.
- **Rule 7 hearing** will occur <u>in-person</u> or by <u>remote means</u> as directed by the court.
- Hearings motions currently set November 1, 2020 March 31, 2021 shall proceed as scheduled by <u>remote means</u> with the assigned judge.
 - ➤ A party must file a Motion for In-Person Hearing with the Presiding Judge if they wish for a hearing on a Motion to proceed <u>in-person</u> prior to April 1, 2021.
- Change of plea/sentencing shall be by <u>remote means</u> on the 4B Docket *UNLESS* one of issues listed below exist, then <u>in-person</u> appearance will be allowed at the annex (if 30 minutes or less) or with the assigned judge in the Courthouse:
 - > Interpreter needed
 - > Prison time anticipated
 - ➤ Non-stipulated and more than 30 minutes needed (only with assigned judge in the Courthouse)
 - ➤ Multiple witness/victim statements
 - ➤ Defendant has significant developmental delays or MH issues
 - > Security issues
 - Diversion entry
 - > PV hearings where prison is sought as a sanction if revoked
 - ➤ Others as approved by the Presiding Judge

• Settlement Conferences

- On **in-custody** criminal cases, may be scheduled and may proceed as previously scheduled with the selected judge <u>in-person</u> *or* by <u>remote means.</u>
- On out-of-custody cases, may be scheduled and may proceed as previously scheduled with the selected judge by <u>remote means</u> UNLESS the PJ approves the matter to proceed <u>in-person</u> the week before the scheduled date.

 - New bench trials may be scheduled prior to March 31, 2021 with the assigned judge to proceed by remote means.
 - A party must file a Motion for In-Person Hearing with the Presiding Judge if they wish to proceed <u>in-person</u>.
- o If the Marion County Circuit Court is subject to Level 3 restrictions under CJO 20-016, all Civil bench trials will be postponed to a date on or after April 1, 2021.

• Status Conferences and Pretrial Hearings

• Motions for Immediate Danger Orders

- Will be accepted at the accounting window Monday-Thursday before 11:00 and Fridays before 2:00 p.m. Motions filed after the deadline will be heard the following judicial day.
- o Family Law Facilitators will be available to assist with forms.
- Hearings will be conducted by phone on the day of the filing or the next judicial day if the Motion is filed after the filing deadline. Court staff will contact the filing party, and the opposing party if post-judgment, to set up the telephone hearing.
